MUSIC NOTES

- ☐ Charles Tournemire (1870-1939) was a distinguished French organist who served as the organiste titulaire at Cesar Franck's old church, the Basilique Ste-Clotilde in Paris, and he also held the position of professor of chamber music at the Paris Conservatoire.
- He recorded an improvisation on the Easter Day Sequence chant "Victimae paschali laudes," which was subsequently transcribed by Maurice Duruflé.
- Victim paschali laudes (Translation): Christians, to the Paschal Victim, offer sacrifice and praise. The sheep are ransomed by the Lamb; and Christ, the undefiled, hath sinners to his Father reconciled. Death with life contended: combat strangely ended! Life's own Champion, slain, yet lives to reign. Tell us, Mary: say, what thou didst see upon the way. The tomb the Living did enclose; I saw Christ's glory as He rose! The angels there attesting; shroud with grave-clothes resting. Christ, my hope, has risen: He goes before you into Galilee. That Christ is truly risen, from the dead we know. Victorious King, Thy mercy show! Amen. Alleluia.
