MUSIC NOTES

- "Le Chemin de la Croix (The Stations of the Cross)," a renowned programmatic work for organ, originated from Marcel Dupré's 1930 concerts at the Brussels Conservatory, where friends approached him to improvise alongside the recitation of Paul Claudel's fourteen poems depicting the Stations of the Cross; on February 13, 1931, Dupré returned to Brussels to perform this transformative concert, improvising musical commentary between each of Claudel's recited poems.
- Translation of Paul Claudel's 14th station poem, "The Body of Jesus Is Laid in a Tomb": The tomb where Christ is put, having suffered and died, the hole hastily unsealed so that he might spend his night there, before the crucified revived and ascended to the Father. This is not merely a new tomb, it is my flesh. It is man, your creature, more profound than the earth! Now that his heart is open and his hands are pierced, there is no cross among us on which his body will not fit. There is no sin in us to which his wound will not correspond. Come to us, from the altar where you are hidden, Redeemer of the World!
