MUSIC NOTES

- Despite being a Romantic composer who was able to write dramatic and inventive works (e.g., Violin Concerto in E minor), perhaps Mendelssohn (1809-1847)'s nature strongly pursued simplicity (e.g., Songs without Words) and loved to uphold tradition (Liszt once called him "Bach reborn"). Mendelssohn's Organ Sonata is more akin to Bach's concept of "Suites," comprising varied pieces meant for instrumental performance rather than adhering to the classical sonata form. Sonata No. 6 in D minor is structured as Chorale and Variations: Andante sostenuto – Allegro molto – Fuga – Finale, and intricately incorporates the Lutheran Bach chorale "Vater unser im Himmelreich" (Our Father, who art in heaven) throughout. In the Fuga, he demonstrates his expertise in traditional counterpoint and structure. But in the Finale, Mendelssohn naturally pours his heart into a simple, tranquil melody, marked by a warm, pure D Major chord, leaving listeners with a sense of serene resolution.
- "Songs My Mother Taught Me" is a poignant art song composed by Antonín Dvořák (1841-1904), featured in his collection *Gypsy Songs*, Op. 55, written in 1880. The song captures a profound sense of nostalgia and longing, reflecting on childhood memories and the passage of time. The simplicity of its melody and the emotional depth of its lyrics, penned by Adolf Heyduk, make it a cherished piece in the art song repertoire. Dvořák's harmonies and sensitive phrasing enhance the song's impact, evoking a profound sense of love and remembrance for mothers.
