MUSIC NOTES

- ☐ The Lachrymae Pavan (Pavan of Tears), composed in 1596 by the English Renaissance lutenist John Dowland (c. 1563 1626), was later arranged for piano or virginal by the renowned English composer William Byrd (c. 1540 1623) between 1604 and 1623.
- The pavane is part of Dowland's Lachrimae or Seaven Teares collection, which consists of instrumental dances based on a tune from one of his popular songs "Flow My Tears."
- Dowland notes that there are different types of "tears" "The tears which Music weeps" can be pleasant; "neither are tears shed always in sorrow but sometimes in joy and gladness."
- In selecting music, my aim was to honor our church's desire to create a tranquil space for solemn reflection on the suffering of those during this celebratory Easter season.
