"Amahl and the Night Visitors opera (2014)

- "Amahl and the Night Visitors" is an opera composed by Gian Carlo Menotti, which premiered on NBC Television in 1951. It tells the story of a disabled boy who meets the Three Magi on their way to Bethlehem to see the Christ Child. This music should provide a warm welcome and musical rebonding, as the chancel choir staged "Amahl and the Night Visitors" for two consecutive years during Pastor Bill Hathaway's time at our church.
- Also, a musical note from David Hancock who will sing for the offertory: "The Call" is the 4th song in Ralph Vaughan Williams's *Five Mystical Songs*. The cycle was written between 1906 and 1911, and sets to music poems by George Herbert, a 17th-century poet and priest. All but the fifth "mystical song" are simple and contemplative, both in Herbert's text and Vaughan William's scoring.
