MUSIC NOTES

- Completed around 1717, the Orgelbüchlein (Little Organ Book) is a collection of short chorale preludes for the organ, each based on a Lutheran chorale tune. "O Mensch, bewein dein Sünde groß" (O mankind, mourn your great sins) is one of the 46 preludes in Orgelbüchlein, built upon the passion hymn of the same name attributed to Sebald Heyden, a German pastor and hymn writer from the 16th century. The hymn itself is a penitential song, urging individuals to reflect on their sins and seek repentance. It remains a beloved piece within the organ repertoire, admired for its spiritual depth and elegant expressions.
- Also a part of the Orgelbüchlein, "Ich ruf zu dir, Herr Jesu Christ" (I call to you, Lord Jesus Christ) is based on the chorale associated with the penitential season of Lent. Bach's use of repeated pedal notes, dissonances, and suspensions builds tension, creating a sense of urgency in the call to the Lord Jesus Christ. The subsequent resolution brings a feeling of solace and assurance, transitioning from humble supplication to God.
- During the Lenten season, the choir will present selected movements of the Mozart Requiem, a choral masterpiece composed by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart in 1791, left unfinished at his death. It is a mass for the dead, expressing themes of mourning, redemption, and hope. Its rich musical tapestry serves as a poignant backdrop for the Lenten journey, guiding us through moments of solemnity, penitence, and ultimately, hopeful anticipation of renewal.
