

MUSIC NOTES

Maurice Duruflé (1902-1986) was a distinguished French composer, organist, and teacher, celebrated for his profound contributions to organ music and choral compositions. He served as the titular organist at St-Etienne-du-Mont from 1929 until his passing in 1986 and held the position of Professor of Harmony at the Paris Conservatoire from 1943 to 1969. In 1930, Duruflé composed his masterpiece, the Prélude, Adagio et Choral Varié sur le thème du Veni Creator, Op. 4, for a competition organized by Les Amis de l'Orgue. He premiered it at the competition and emerged as the winner. Dedicated to his mentor, Louis Vierne, this composition centers around the plainchant hymn for Pentecost "Veni Creator Spiritus," presenting Duruflé's mastery of intricate harmonies and expansive musical structures. The piece comprises three movements: a hauntingly beautiful, fluid prelude; a deeply prayerful adagio; and a choral varié featuring four variations. Duruflé seamlessly weaves the plainchant themes, ranging from delicate and introspective to majestic and triumphant.
